



Frequently Asked Questions Protocol: Visiting with Neighbors Independent Living Residents at Holly Creek

Effective September 24, 2020

Any or all of these measures are subject to change at any time in response to developments in county, state, or federal policy and health conditions in our area.

Q. May Independent Living (IL) residents visit other IL residents in their apartments without needing to self-isolate for 14 days afterward?

A. Yes. If you do visit a neighbor, we ask that you follow good infection control practices to avoid potential spread of the COVID-19 virus.

Good infection control practices include:

- Proper hand washing before and after visits
- Properly wearing a face mask during the visit
- Maintaining six-foot social distancing

In regard to social distancing, please follow these guidelines:

- Limit the number of visitors according to the size of the apartment. For example: a two-bedroom apartment with a large living room can safely accommodate more people than a small one-bedroom apartment
- If the weather is nice and there are only one or two visitors, conduct the visit on the balcony in fresh air rather than indoors.

Q: Is it OK to share a meal when visiting with a neighbor?

A: Yes. Keep in mind that, just as our dining rooms restrict the number of diners to assure social distancing, so, too, should the host assure social distancing during a meal by limiting the number of guests and arranging safe seating.
